

## **THE WORSHIPFUL COMPANY OF CARMEN'S VIVA AWARD**

The Viva Shield, together with a gold medal and citation, is awarded annually for the invention, principle, development, production, implemented system or other idea which contributes most notably to the advancement of transport in Great Britain and Northern Ireland, with particular reference to road transport, in the preceding year.

## **THE WORSHIPFUL COMPANY OF CARMEN'S SIR HENRY ROYCE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION AWARD**

Presented by the Sir Henry Royce Memorial Foundation in 1983, for annual award by the Worshipful Company of Carmen, to honour outstanding work in extending the frontiers of achievement and in the pursuit of excellence in the field of transport, during the preceding year.

It is intended to use this award, which has been endowed by the Trustees of the Foundation, primarily to recognise events in the sphere of transport, of national or international significance, involving skill, dedication or technical perfection of the highest order, in conformity with Sir Henry Royce's philosophy of the pursuit of excellence.

## **THE WORSHIPFUL COMPANY OF CARMEN'S AWARD OF MERIT**

Founded by the Worshipful Company of Carmen in 1988, for annual award, to honour outstanding achievement or events in the sphere of transport, of national or international importance, which lie outside the scope of other Company Awards.

## **THE HERBERT CROW MEMORIAL AWARD**

It is bestowed upon "a person who has significantly furthered knowledge and development of transport and logistics by academic study, publication, analysis, research, training; with management, production or communications systems, or by comparable activities of a broadly educational and acknowledge-enhancing nature".

## **ENVIRONMENTAL AWARD**

The award should recognize a measurably significant, public sector, charitable or not for profit project which has helped to create a cleaner, quieter, healthier or aesthetically more pleasing transport environment, whilst facilitating the safe and efficient movement of people and goods. Projects may involve infrastructure, buildings, systems, schemes, vehicles or equipment or any combination of these, initially in the UK.

The citation may recognize significant contributions by partners, including commercial bodies where appropriate.

The project should have been completed or substantially completed, within the previous two years.

Applications etc should be supported by a full description, covering objectives, scope, sponsor(s) and partner(s), costs and evidence of benefits achieved, ideally supported by independent opinion.

The award is made at the Company's discretion and should be given to projects where the submission demonstrates a measurable benefit.

## **THE LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD**

The Carmen's Company Lifetime Achievement Award was founded in 2011, to recognise and honour individual outstanding service to transport in the UK, within and without the industry, over an extended period of two decades or more, usually though not invariably presented on individual retirement.
