### THE CARMEN'S GRADUATE AWARDS

...for the most outstanding MSc dissertation in the field of transport and logistics from a student at **Imperial College**, and also at the **University of Westminster**

These two awards were founded in 1960; the **Imperial College** Award in memory of the late Past Master Raymond Birch CBE and the **University of Westminster** in memory of the late Assistant Herbert Crow. Originally known as the Carmen's Apprentices Awards, since 2005 they have become the Carmen's Graduate Awards. Each award comprises a framed citation and a cheque for £250; both are now presented by the Carmen's Benevolent Trust.
